This Week's Worship and Reflection



"What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Luke 10:25b

The parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) is such a familiar story, isn't it? We all know it so well. We have acted it out in youth groups, and

we have taught it, or heard it taught, at various stages throughout our lives. It's a story that seems to have a very simple meaning – that we should love our neighbour, no matter who that is. We should love all people, even those who are different from us, and even those that we don't like.

But the truth is that this is a story with layers of meaning, as many of Jesus' parables are. Which is why we still read it, and talk about it, and preach about it today.

It's fascinating to me that in answer to a religious expert who thinks that he knows what to <u>do</u> to obtain eternal life, Jesus tells the story of a man who can do absolutely nothing to save himself. A man lying in a ditch who is completely helpless. He can't do anything to save himself. In fact, he ends up relying not on a priest or a Levite, but on an outsider, a Samaritan, to save him.

All of us today are in fact that person in the ditch. Captive to sin. In need of mercy. And Jesus is the one who alone can help us. This story turns out to be as much about being open to God's mercy, as it is about helping a neighbour in need. A story about the grace and mercy of our loving God, and about all the ways that we are called to extend that love to others. But before we can extend it, we need to receive it, from the neighbour who stops to help us. And thanks be to God that our neighbour is none other than Jesus himself.
